Since Diana Irey has been commissioner:

- ★ Washington County has enjoyed the second-highest rate of job growth in the entire region.
- ★ Diana led the push for the build out of the Southpointe Development, which created over 5,000 high-quality jobs, and secured the land for the expansion of Southpointe II, which upon completion will create an additional estimated 3,800 jobs.
- ★ She secured the land for the 153-acre Starpointe Industrial Park, which is expected to generate 12,000 new jobs once completed.
- ★ Diana helped develop the California Technology Park, which has brought approximately 800 new jobs to the area.
- ★ She helped create the Washington County Economic Development Partnership—a one stop shop that makes our county a magnet for employers by helping them set up business here.
- ★ Diana started the WELL Program, which promotes healthy lifestyles for Washington County workers, reducing sick time and cutting the county's insurance costs.
